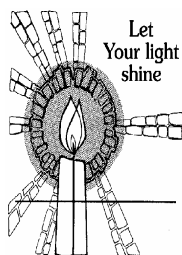

The Second Collection this weekend is the Catholic Relief Services Collection. The State Department estimates that nearly 5 million people have been displaced, forced to leave their homes, because of the war in Iraq. This Collection supports resettlement services for refugees, serves victims of human trafficking, and provided pastoral care and advocacy. Of the 50,000 total refugees authorized to enter the United States in 2007, nearly one-third were helped by USCCB Migrations and Refugee Services, one organization receiving funds from the Collection. When you donate you give hope.

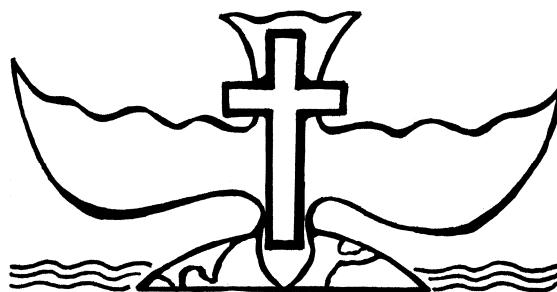

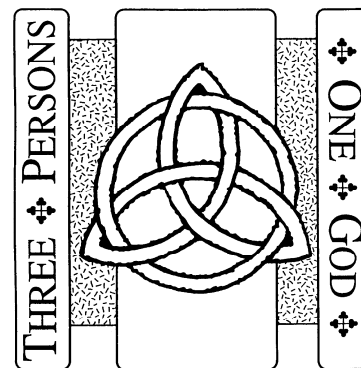

THE RESPONSIBILITY OF OUR FAITH

Today is a day simply to ponder the fact that in baptism we were claimed by God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The first reading from Deuteronomy prompts us to fix in our hearts the truth that God is the Lord of both heaven and earth and there is no other god. Saint Paul reminds us that, because we received the Spirit of adoption in baptism, we are now children of God. In the Gospel Jesus charges us with the responsibility to make other disciples. These realities make today's solemnity a day of praise, adoration, and responsibility. It is a fitting day to thank God for the absolutely free gift of faith that we were given in baptism. It is also a day to ask God for strength to take on the responsibility of sharing that faith with others.

First Reading — The Lord is God in the heavens above and on earth below and there is no other (Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40).

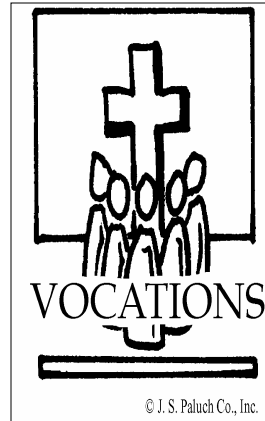
Psalm — Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own (Psalm 33).
