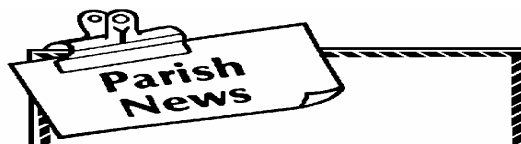

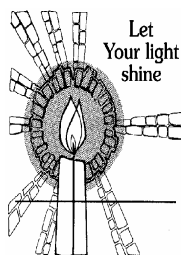

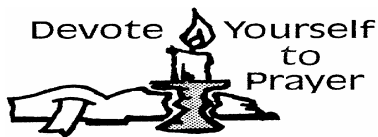

## OPEN TO GOD'S WORD

Today the Church begins a stretch of Ordinary Time that will last for five months. **Psalm** — Give thanks to the Lord, his love is everlasting (Psalm 107).

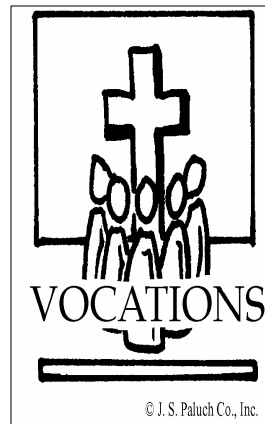
