



**The first day of Faith Formation for Emerson-William School will be held on Saturday, September 26th for grades 1-6.**



**This weekend September 12th & 13th, on the 46th Anniversary of the Founding of The Church of the Incarnation Parish, at the 5:00pm and 9:30am Masses we will prayerfully remember our Pastors Fr. John J. Crawford, Fr. John F. Edwards, and Fr. James M. Moran along with all the priests who have served in our parish.** In today's bulletin, we include the first in a series of reflections on the "call" to priesthood written by priests who have served us through the years. The series continues for the next few weeks. As we recognize leadership and service, let us pray for these priests, all priests, and future priests in our daily prayer.

### **My Journey to Priesthood....**

**My call to the priesthood happened at a very early age. As far back as I can remember, I always wanted to be a Catholic priest. I entered St. Thomas Seminary at fourteen years of age and was ordained at the age of twenty-five. The Church and priesthood have changed a great deal since 1961. On the occasion of my twenty-fifth anniversary which I celebrated at the Church of the Incarnation, I realized that my love for the Church and the priesthood had to be re-negotiated. I needed to re-commit myself all over again but at a deeper level . I guess that people who have been married for twenty-five years have to do the same thing. Hopefully, my dedication to my vocation is stronger than it was on my ordination day. It won't be long before I will be celebrating my 40th anniversary.**

**Currently, I have two full time jobs. I am the pastor of St. Mark the Evangelist in West Hartford and the Archdiocesan Director of Religious Education. That office is located at St. Thomas Seminary. I ask for your continued prayers and I promise to keep all of you in mine.**

## LISTENING AND RESPONDING

There are three interwoven themes in today's readings: listening to God, faith vs. good works, and losing our life in order to find it. How are they related?

The Suffering Servant of Isaiah undergoes much distress and ridicule, but is able to bear it because he has listened to the promptings of God day after day. The psalm tells us that God listens, too. God hears our prayers for help and is always ready to save us. As our faith deepens, so does our desire to do the works of justice and charity that build up the reign of God. God directs our actions in ways we often cannot see, and we don't always see the results. We are called upon in faith to trust that what we do is enough, and that willingness to listen to God's promptings will lead us in the right way.

**First Reading** — The Lord GOD is my help; who will prove me wrong? (Isaiah 50:5-9a).


**Psalm** — I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living (Psalm 116).

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In this country, we don't name our churches "The Fourth Avenue Catholic Church," but rather seek a patron saint or mystery of faith. We inherit this tradition from an old Roman custom via medieval England. Interestingly, that has not been the practice elsewhere, and parishes abroad often do carry just the name of the neighborhood. In Ireland, the Roman (English) practices didn't take hold, and so churches are known simply by the street they are on.

Increasingly in the United States, we are seeing a familiar European pattern emerge when a few churches, each bearing the name of a patron saint or mystery, are gathered into one parish that bears a different name. Thus, we might hear of a parish of "Midvalley City" comprised of Saint Mary, Saint Francis, and Saint Ursula churches. Once a church has been consecrated, its name may not normally be changed. Therefore, when parishes are merged, a new name is given to the parish, which may or may not be that of a heavenly patron, but the church buildings retain their names. In the process, we have lost sight of some worthy patrons of old, but have also seen new parishes open dedicated to twentieth-century saints like Edith Stein, Katharine Drexel, and Blessed Mother Teresa.
