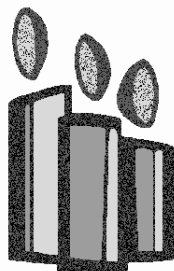

Blessed Sacrament Chapel....The contemporary design of The Church of the Incarnation is in the general form of a crucifix. In the east transept or east wing, we have our Blessed Sacrament Chapel. It is a sacred place where we can find the intimacy and quiet of our prayer to be in the presence of Our Lord. It is a sacred place of worship originally designed for the celebration of daily Mass. While all people are welcomed to worship in the main church, we do offer the Chapel as an alternative for families and children living with disabilities to fully participate in the Celebration of the Eucharist. Historically, the Blessed Sacrament Chapel has been reserved for children with their parents, since Mass being offered on the main altar can easily be observed; as well as reserved for those in the faith community with disabilities. We continue to honor those objectives today with the sincere hope that our parents will see the great advantage the Chapel provides for children to learn about participating in the Mass. Parents can use the Picture Books depicting the Mass with their children in the main church or the west transept, these Picture Books can also be found in the chapel pews. Additionally, we invite parishioners with disabilities to the comfort and privacy that our chapel can provide. As our parents prepare their children for Mass and as our disabled are welcomed to participate at Mass in a comfortable setting, we offer our continued support, patience, and understanding. It is with this trust and gentleness of spirit that we listen to what Jesus said: "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them: because the Kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

Lenten Regulations: Catholics ages 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays during Lent. The rule does not apply when health or ability to work would be seriously impacted. Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, but have not yet marked their 59th are to fast on Good Friday. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to individual needs but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, i.e. milk/juices, are allowed.

For the Season of Lent, The Sanctus (Holy, Holy) and Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) will be sung. They are hymns 859/862 in the Missal.

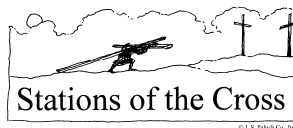
Easter Communion Regulation: Catholics are obliged to receive Communion at least once between the 1st Sunday of Lent & Trinity Sunday.

SOMETHING NEW

“See, I am doing something new!” (Isaiah 43:19). All during this Lenten season, the scriptures have revealed the truth of these words, proclaimed in today’s first reading from the prophet Isaiah. We have heard about a bush in the desert aflame but not consumed. We have listened to a parable about a father, the depth of whose love for his prodigal son was almost inconceivable. Today, instead of condemning a woman caught in the act of adultery and joining in stoning her to death, the Lord Jesus sends her on her way, away from what would have been certain death, admonishing her to sin no more. Indeed, God has been doing something new in our midst. Even when we are trapped in sin, with no perceivable way out, we are offered forgiveness when we turn to the Lord with repentant hearts. Let us remember that God has done something new in the heart of each of us.

Gospel — A woman caught in the act of adultery is brought to Jesus. He challenges anyone without sin to throw the first stone (John 8:1-11) *or John 11:1-45 [3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45]*.

SAINT TORIBIO DE MOGROVEJO (1538-1606)**March 23**

In times of crisis, God always “surprises” the Church with unlikely saints, through whom Christ’s light radiates beyond their local communities to illumine the universal Church. Charles Borromeo was such a saint: appointed Archbishop of Milan at twenty-one by his papal uncle, epitomizing the corruption that the Reformers condemned, Charles instead inspired a revival that reinvigorated a Church devastated by the Reformation. His less well-known contemporary, Toribio de Mongrovejo, was God’s “saintly surprise” in the New World. Spanish-born lawyer, professor, head of the feared Inquisition, Toribio was still a layman when a grateful king appointed him Archbishop of far-off Lima. Once in Peru, however, Toribio was appalled at the abuse of indigenous peoples by the occupying *conquistadores*—his fellow countrymen—and by the complicity of the clergy. He became the natives’ devoted advocate, building churches, schools, hospitals, and the first seminary in the Americas, publishing catechisms and prayer books in the native languages he painstakingly mastered. Four hundred years later, whenever Pope Benedict welcomes Latin American bishops to Rome, he always invokes “the shining example of San Toribio.”

A Family Perspective....Each day we hurl verbal stones of ridicule, criticism, name-calling and put-downs and they are killers. Jesus admonished us: “Whoever is without sin can throw the first stone.” In other words, no one is qualified to throw stones. Rid your home of violence and stop the verbal stoning.
