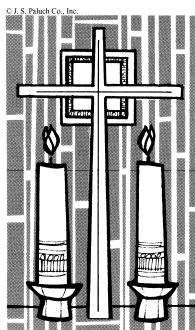

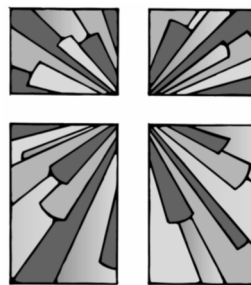

There will be a House of Bread collection next Saturday. Coffee & sugar are needed. Thank you.

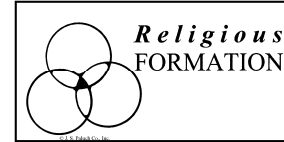

A Weekly Bible Study

Solemnity of the
Most Holy Trinity
Exodus 34:4-9



The Lord is about to give Moses a second chance. A bit of time has passed since Moses received the Ten Commandments and subsequently smashed them in anger. God now commands him to return to Mt. Sinai with blank tablets in hand. Fearing chastisement, Moses is reluctant to return as he is aware of his people's guilt in disobeying Yahweh. But he hears one word that gives him great encouragement. It is "Lord." And that reassurance is further solidified as Yahweh cries out to Moses: "The LORD, the LORD, a God gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in love and fidelity."

We certainly see our own behavior mirrored in that of Moses. At times we hide from God out of fear or shame. We easily distance ourselves, misjudging the Lord's goodness. We often close the ears of our hearts as the Lord calls out his name to us. We fail to hear in that name the very same reassurance that Moses did.

This passage seems an odd choice for so solemn a feast as The Most Holy Trinity. But as we think about it there are so many gifts wrapped up in the Sacred Name of God. There is obviously the triune Godhead, Father, Son and Spirit who call to mind the unfolding of love within the richness of salvation history. There is the unique unity of three persons that draws us into the essence of true Christian community. And lest we forget, there is the *nature* of that Godhead so beautifully illustrated in this passage from Exodus.

The next time we utter the Sacred Name of God, let us be reminded of the Lord's reassurance to Moses and to us: *I am gracious, merciful, slow to anger and abounding in love and fidelity.* And let us hear in these words another invitation from our gracious God: *Bring the blank tablets of your heart to my holy mountain and there I will forever inscribe my name.*

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The liturgy seems reluctant to return to Ordinary Time from the joys of Easter, and so the festivities extend to today's celebration of the mystery of God's relationship to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Gospel today centers the question of our relationship with God in the struggle of Nathaniel to believe that it is possible to experience "rebirth" in the Spirit. The answer of Jesus is that God's response to the messes of this world is the mystery of saving love in Jesus Christ and the outpouring of an empowering Spirit.

Western church architecture often tops a church building with a spire, indicating humanity's reach to a transcendent God. The Eastern Church responds with onion-shaped domes, indicating the Spirit's being poured down upon humanity precisely at this locale, the gathering of the faithful for the Divine Liturgy. This familiar design encodes a great mystery: here, at the Lord's table, we experience the outpouring of the Spirit for the life of the world. Nathaniel came to Jesus by night, since he was still working out the meaning of his life. A life attuned to the inner life of the Trinity must always be given to the light of day.

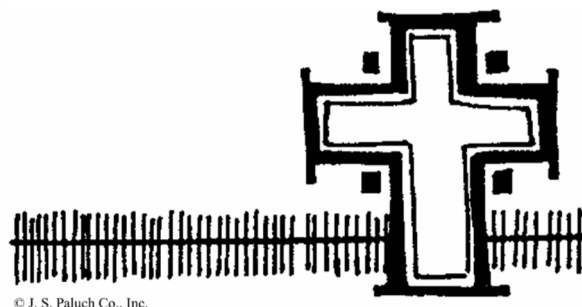

LIFE IN THE TRINITY

The name of the Trinity is, without a doubt, the most familiar sacred name to us. We speak it every time we make the sign of the cross, and it forms the heart of our Creed. Trinity Sunday is a good day, however, to stop and reflect on the unique role of each of the three persons we name so often in the Trinity and in our own lives. When we celebrate the Eucharist on Sunday, we come together as the Body of Christ through our baptism, and through the power of the Holy Spirit we offer the whole prayer of the Mass to God the Father. This presence of the Trinity does not stop when we leave church on Sunday. We are—always and everywhere—members of the Body, and every thing we do as members of that Body is empowered by the Holy Spirit, all of it offered to the glory of our loving Father.

Take a moment each day this week to reflect on how the persons of the Trinity were present to you during the day, and how other people came to see the presence of the Trinity in your witness to the Good News.

Confirmation Name Essay: Peter

Saint Peter was shown to be the leader of the apostles, and had a special relationship with Jesus. He was born in Bethsaida, in Galilee, and his brother Andrew was also an apostle. He witnessed many important events in Jesus' life, such as the transfiguration, when Jesus raised a girl from the dead. Peter was also the first disciple to see the risen Jesus Christ at the Sea of Galilee. His name was originally Simon, but when Jesus told him that he was going to be the head of the Church, it was changed to Peter, which means "the rock." Peter was then the head of the Church after Jesus died, and became the first pope. He was also the first person to perform miracles in the name of Jesus. Jesus' trust in Peter along with his performing miracles show how loyal he was and that he always had faith in God and acted the way God wants us to.

I am choosing the name of Saint Peter for my confirmation name because of the example he sets for us. He always trusted God and Jesus, and that is why Jesus put so much trust in him and made him head of the Church.
